NOTABLE CASES

- **Edward E. Gillen Co. v. Specialty Granules.** Represented Specialty Granules in a breach of contract case related to the supply of stone for the 31st Street Harbor Project. Second-chaired a sixteen-day arbitration hearing.
- **Joseph Berrios, et al. v. Cook County Board of Commissioners, et al.** Represented plaintiffs who challenged the constitutionality, on federal and state grounds, of a Cook County ethics ordinance that limits certain persons from making campaign contributions to the candidates of their choice.
- **Melissa Pielet, et al. v. Dennis Hiffman, et al.** Represented general partners of a limited partnership in a breach of fiduciary duty action arising out of the purchase and alleged misappropriation of tax increment financing bonds. The potential exposure for the general partners exceeded \$100 million.
- **Kristensen v. Credit Payment Servs. Inc., et al.** Obtained summary judgment and affirmance by the Ninth Circuit on behalf of a lending institution in a \$150 million Telephone Consumer Protection Act case.
- **Sprint affiliate litigation arising from Sprint-Clearwire and Sprint-Virgin Mobile transactions.** Represented three Sprint affiliates in litigation in Delaware and Illinois that sought to enjoin the closing of an \$11 billion transaction in which Sprint planned to acquire a majority interest in a new competing telecommunications company in breach of the parties' affiliate agreements. When Sprint announced that it was acquiring Virgin Mobile USA,

Inc., we filed another lawsuit on behalf of the affiliates in Illinois seeking to enjoin the closing of the Sprint-Virgin transaction.

- **People of State of Illinois v. Aaron Thurman, Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, Criminal Division (Pro Bono).** Second-chaired a first-degree murder trial. Obtained an acquittal for the defendant.
- **Zoning matters.** Represented AT&T in zoning, permitting, and breach of contract cases related to the construction of cellular towers. Represented one of the nation's largest renewable energy developers in zoning and breach of contract cases related to the construction of wind farms.
